Summer Camp Rules

1. All camp fees must be paid before going to camp
2. Medical forms must be current before going to camp
3. Campers need not travel to camp with troop if other travel arrangements are made
4. Scouts will properly wear Class A Scout shirt during travel
5. Scouts will wear a seat belt during travel
6. Campers may stay less than a full week if necessary but without refund
7. Tents will be assigned by the Scoutmaster and SPL
8. No more than 2 Scouts in a tent
9. No talking in tents after taps
10. All campers must arise at reveille
11. Scouts will cheerfully perform their assigned chores
12. No aggressive behavior will be permitted
13. Scouts will not use or take another's property without permission
14. No cutting of live plants is permitted
15. Do not disturb any animal life

Warning: Any behavior unbecoming to a Scout including but not limited to threats, aggressive behavior, sexual misconduct, intentional damage to Scout property, or theft will get only one warning and the second time the Scout will be sent home.

Summer Camp is the highlight of the Scouting program. Every Scout family should make an effort to adjust their schedule so the Scout can attend a week of summer camp. If the Troop's scheduled week is not a convenient time, arrangements can be made for a Scout to attend a different week. A Scout may even attend more than 1 week. Older Scouts interested in leadership training may want to consider attending White Stag camp as an extra or alternative.

There is a late fee penalty of \$10.

All Scouts and Scouters must have submitted a medical form Parts A, B, & C which is not over 12 months old on file with the troop. All medical forms are due no later than the April Court of Honor.
